- Released on 11 February 1990, Mandela, who was imprisoned for 26 1 years, plunged wholeheartedly into freedom and human rights, the goals he and others had set out to do almost forty years earlier. In 1991, after being banned for decades, the first national conference of the African Nationalist Congress or ANC was held inside South Africa. At this conference, Nelson Mandela was elected president of the ANC while his lifelong friend and colleague, Oliver Tambo, became the organization's
- His life has been an inspiration to people who are oppressed and deprived and to all who are against oppression and deprivation. Nelson Mandela accepted the 1993 Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of South Africans who 10 suffered and sacrificed so much to bring peace to their land.
- In 1994, he was elected as the president of South Africa making him the first democratically elected president. He ended his presidency term on June 14, 1999. Mandela died at the age of 95 in 2013 after suffering from a prolonged respiratory infection. More than 25 schools, universities, and 15 educational institutions have been named after him and at least 19 scholarships and foundations bear the name Nelson Mandela, while more than 95 sculptures, statues, or pieces of art have been made of him or dedicated to him. The United Nations even officially declared that July 18 as Nelson Mandela International Day (or Mandela Day) in 2009 and celebrated its first Mandela Day in 2010 to honour the legacy of South Africa's former president and his values through volunteering and

He also serves as a role model for startup businesses. In 2017, he was ranked second in the annual "World's 50 Greatest Leaders" list by Fortune. On 10 September 2018, he announced that he will retire from Alibaba and pursue educational work. September 10, 2019, Daniel Zhang will succeed Jack Ma as the executive chairman of Alibaba Group.

# Malnutrition goals in Africa 'very far away'

A new report shows that no country in Africa will meet goals set to end childhood malnutrition by the year 2030. That target was set by the United Nations in 2015 as a Sustainable Development Goal. The UN adopted a set of goals, "to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure prosperity for all as part of a new sustainable development agenda". The new report is published in the journal Nature. It identifies poor child nutrition and low levels of education across 51 African countries. These were key factors in countries battling to provide children with sufficient food. Researcher Simon Hay said the goal of ending childhood malnutrition was always an "aspirational" target. He said: "Ending childhood malnutrition is very, very far away."

## Famous Personalities (10 marks)

# **Oprah Winfrey**

- Since her television career began back in 1973, she has won 34 Emmy Awards, and her show has topped talk-show ratings for 14 consecutive seasons. The emotionally-charged, self-help approach of Winfrey's programme appeals to millions. An accomplished actress, she was nominated for her role in 'The Colour Purple'. In 1998, The Time Magazine named Winfrey as one of the 100 most influential people of the 20th Century.
- Her success has not just been on screen. She set up a production company called Harpo Productions. When she expanded into publishing, millions of fans gathered to buy her magazine, called 'O'. Winfrey stands as an inspiration in the world of media, entertainment and in public discussion. Oprah influenced people through her talk show. When Winfrey talks, her viewers an estimated 14 million daily in the U.S. and millions more in 132 other countries listen. If she recommends a novel through her book club, it is pretty much guaranteed to top the best-seller lists, and she makes self-help gurus into household names.
- 3 She is also known for her generosity towards the poor and needy. She established the 'world's largest piggy bank' to raise funds to send disadvantaged kids to college. People all over the country contributed spare change to raise more than \$1 million. She matched the amount 20 raised by the people.
- 4 Born in 1954, Winfrey was raised by her grandmother in Mississippi. By the age of three, she was reading the Bible and **reciting** it in church. A lonely child, she preferred reading books. When a teacher noticed the young girl reading during lunch, he helped her to get a scholarship to a better school. Winfrey's talent for public performance and spontaneity in answering questions helped her win beauty contests and public attention. In 1971, she was crowned Miss Fire Prevention in Nashville.
- 5 By 1984, Winfrey was hosting WLS-TV morning talk show in Chicago. Two years later, The Oprah Winfrey show was born. It went to become the highest-rated talk show in TV history. She continues to encourage viewers to improve their lives and the world. That is Oprah Winfrey's genius, and will be her legacy, as the changes she has created in the talk show continue to spread throughout our culture and shape our lives.





  - > The introduction should contain a **thesis statement**. It should present the topic of your paper and also make a comment about your position in relation to the topic. Your thesis statement should tell your reader what the paper is about and also help guide your writing and keep your argument focused.
  - The body of your essay should have at least two (2) paragraphs. Each paragraph must include a topic sentence which relates the discussion back to the thesis statement. Include relevant examples and evidence to support your topic sentences. Ensure that transition sentences are present to create a good flow to the essay.
  - > The conclusion of your essay should wrap all of your arguments and restate the main arguments in a simplified manner.
